

## Human Rights Case Presentation

Instructions:

The requirements for this presentation are the following:

- Groups of 3 students
- Choose a human rights violation case of your interest. It can be from Chile or any other country of your choice.

The presentation should contain the following:

- Introduction: introduce the presentation by giving your opinion about the chosen case and why it is an interesting case for your group to present.
- Description: describe the situation, date, context, events and people involved using the past tenses, passive voice and linking words correctly. What happened? When did the events happen? How did the events occur? Which human rights were violated?
- Legal status: provide information about the current legal situation of the people involved or the legal punishment the transgressors should receive if the case hasn't had a resolution yet.
- Conclusion and arguments: present your conclusion and arguments in favor or against the case, the legal system's performance and the legal punishment (sentences given to the transgressors and the restitution or reparation measures given to the victims).

When working on your presentation, consider the rubric indicators in order to fulfill the requirements of the evaluation.
